RESEARCH PHOTOGRAPHY AT THE MAXWELL MUSEUM OF ANTHROPOLOGY

The Maxwell Museum distinguishes between research photography and photography for public dissemination. This agreement is for research photography only.

- 1. Objects may not be available or suitable for photography as a matter of law, university policy, or museum policy, or because the objects are on display or are otherwise in use, or for similar reasons. If there is any doubt regarding the availability or suitability of an object for photography, the final decision rests with the Maxwell Museum.
- 2. There are two ways to obtain research photographs.
 - a. The Maxwell Museum can provide images, or in rare cases may require the researcher to use Museum-provided images. The fees for this service are available from the Curator of Photography.
 - b. With curatorial approval, researchers may take their own research photographs, using their own equipment and available light. There is no charge for such photographs, over and above any fees for curatorial assistance.
- 3. Research photographs shall not be used except for (a) personal research, (b) presentations to research audiences, and (c) classroom presentations at the college or graduate level. Any other use of photographs (including but not limited to public talks or dissemination via paper or electronic media) requires a separate agreement with the Maxwell Museum, and may require the payment of additional fees.
